

# How to Configure Nokia PC Suite for the Nokia 7650 or 3650 phones

Nokia has a different version of the Nokia PC Suite specifically for the Nokia 7650 and 3650. This can be used with the TDK Bluetooth USB and PC card devices.

## About this Guide

There are several steps you'll need to take to use Nokia PC suite, we recommend that you only undertake them if you feel confident installing software applications and making configuration settings.


**WARNING! This guide is not too long!** But please follow it concisely - we are confident you will get it all working smoothly.

**PLEASE FOLLOW THIS GUIDE CAREFULLY AND CONCISELY** – if there are statements in **RED** as above please take care and do exactly as advised.

**ADVICE IN THIS GOLD COLOUR** is valuable - it will save you from encountering problem areas in subsequent steps; please pay attention to it too.






## 1. Getting connected with Bluetooth

To get the Nokia PC Suite to connect to the Nokia 7650/3650 you need to connect to the Bluetooth serial port of the Nokia phone. Once the Nokia phone has the Bluetooth Address of your Bluetooth adaptor it will drop the current connection and then re-connect. Only after the re-connection will the Nokia PC Suite for the 7650 and 3650 work.

<b>Start</b>		Ensure your TDK Bluetooth USB or PC card is installed on your computer
<b>Step 1</b>		Install the Nokia PC Suite on your computer. You should now see a new icon in your system tray (usually in the bottom right of your monitor, next to the clock).
<b>Advice: Step 2</b>		You should have paired your Nokia phone to your PC. If you have not done this, use the TDK Nokia 7650/3650 Assistant available as part of the latest TDK Bluetooth software. This can be found by right-clicking the Bluetooth icon in your system tray and selecting Applications.







<p><b>Step 2</b></p>		<p>From the Bluetooth icon in your system tray, select <b>Setup</b>, then <b>Configuration</b>, then click the <b>Local Services</b> tab. If you do not have the <b>Setup</b> option, choose <b>Advanced Configuration</b> and then click the <b>Local Services</b> tab.</p> <p>Under the column <b>Service Name</b>, you will see <b>Bluetooth Serial Port</b> listed. This will have a <b>COM Port</b> assigned to it. Note the COM Port number the <b>Bluetooth Serial Port</b> is using. For example <b>COM4</b>.</p>
<p><b>Step 3</b></p>		<p>Next, right-click the Nokia PC Suite tray icon (mRouter) and select <b>Properties</b></p>
<p><b>Step 4</b></p>	<p>Tick the <b>COM Port</b> found in <b>Step 3</b>. Then click <b>Close</b>.</p> 	
<p><b>Step 5</b></p>	<p><b>All Users</b></p>	<p><b>During the next few steps you may be asked to accept connection requests on the phone and on the PC. This is safe, and necessary for the installation.</b></p>
<p><b>Step 6</b></p>		<p>From <b>My Bluetooth Places</b> find your Nokia phone and double click on the <b>Serial Port</b> icon. Only if you have successfully paired with the Nokia phone you will be able to do this.</p>
<p><b>Step 7</b></p>	 <p>You will see a dialog box stating your serial service is connected to <b>COM0</b>, tick the box and Click <b>OK</b>.</p>

<p><b>Step 8</b></p>	<p>You will now see a disconnect notice saying that the <b>remote device closed the connection</b>. This is normal: click <b>OK</b>.</p> 							
<p><b>Step 9</b></p>	<p>Next you will see the <b>Nokia PC Suite</b> icon change from  to  as the Nokia phone connects back to the PC.</p>							
<p><b>Step 10</b></p>		<p>Now you can open <b>Nokia PC Suite</b>, click <b>Start, Program Files, Nokia PC Suite 4</b> or the desktop shortcut (if generated) and begin to use the applications.</p>

<p><i>Advice:</i></p>	<p>When you run <b>PC Suite</b> for the first time a setup wizard will guide you through the program settings, simply follow the on-screen instructions.</p>							


## 2. Disconnecting & reconnecting PC Suite

When you have finished using PC Suite you will have to manually disconnect.

<p><b>Step 1</b></p>		<p>When you have finished, exit PC Suite</p>
<p><b>Step 2</b></p>		<p>Go to <b>My Bluetooth Places</b></p>
<p><b>Step 3</b></p>		<p>Double click on <b>My Device</b></p>

<b>Advice: Step 3</b>	<b>XP Users</b>	XP users should click on <b>View My Bluetooth Services for Step 3.</b>
<b>Step 4</b>	 My Bluetooth Serial Port	Right click on <b>My Bluetooth Serial Port</b> or <b>Bluetooth Serial Port</b> then click on <b>Stop</b> or <b>Disable</b>
<b>Step 5</b>	Before you finish, right click again on <b>My Bluetooth Serial Port</b> or <b>Bluetooth Serial Port</b> then click on <b>Start</b> or <b>Enable</b> . This allows future sessions with the Nokia PC Suite to work correctly	
<b>Advice:</b>	An alternative way to do this is to turn off the phone! When you turn it on again the Bluetooth connection will have been broken.

Easy Life 2		Right-click on a picture, select <b>Send to Bluetooth</b> and <b>Nokia 7650/3650</b>

#### Sending a Business card, appointment for picture from your handset to your PC

Easy Life 3		Want to reverse the trick above? There's a way using <b>My Bluetooth Places</b> of course!
Easy Life 3		Highlight a business card, select <b>Options, Send business Card, Via Bluetooth</b> and from the device list select your PC.
Easy Life 3		Highlight an appointment, select <b>Options, Send, Via Bluetooth</b> and from the device list select your PC.
Easy Life 3		Highlight an image, select <b>Options, Send, Via Bluetooth</b> and from the device list select your PC.
